

NEW BEGINNINGS SURVEY

By now, most of you should have received the New Beginnings Survey, either as a weblink in an email from the church or as a paper copy. It is critically important that we hear from ALL members of the church, youth and adults, to provide guidance to the committee that is seeking to recommend a new ministry in the local Webster area for consideration by the Session and, ultimately, the congregation. This recommendation is in response to the consensus from the 2016 New Beginnings study groups that WPC undertake a Mission Redefinition initiative to revitalize our mission and ministry going forward into the future. Please take the brief amount of time to complete the survey and return it either online (preferred) or dropped off/mailed to the church office no later than **Sunday, February 5**. Additional paper copies are available in the church office, if needed.

From the Pastor...

In each time and place, there are particular problems and crises through which God calls the church to act. The church, guided by the Spirit, humbled by its own simplicity and instructed by all attainable knowledge, seeks to discern the will of God and learn how to obey in these concrete situations. The following are particularly urgent at the present time.

- a. *God has created the peoples of the earth to be one universal family. In his reconciling love, he overcomes barriers between brothers (and sisters) and breaks down every form of discrimination based on racial or ethnic difference, real or imaginary. The church is called to bring all men (and women) to receive and uphold one another as persons in all relationships of life; in employment, housing, education, leisure, marriage, family, church, and the exercise of political rights. Therefore, the church labors for the abolition of all racial discrimination and ministers to those injured by it. Congregations, individuals, or groups of Christians who exclude, dominate, or patronize their fellow men (and women), however subtly, resist the Spirit of God and bring contempt to the faith which they profess.*
- b. *God's reconciliation in Jesus Christ is the ground of peace, justice, and freedom among nations which all powers of government are called to serve and defend. The church, in its own life, is called to practice forgiveness of enemies and commend to the nations as practical politics the search for cooperation and peace. This search requires that the nations pursue fresh and responsible relations across every line of conflict, even at the risk of national security, to reduce areas of strife and to broaden international understanding. Reconciliation among nations becomes particularly urgent as countries develop nuclear, chemical, and biological weapons, diverting manpower and resources from constructive uses and risking annihilation of (humankind). Although nations may serve God's purposes in history, the church which identifies the sovereignty of any one nation or any one way of life with the cause of God denies the Lordship of Christ and betrays its calling.*

9.43 – 9.45 “The Confession of 1967”

Dear Church Family,

It has been said that if we fail to learn from history, we are destined to repeat it. These words from the Confession of 1967 spoke to a particular time and place with a very specific set of circumstances affecting life in our country and around the world. I believe that we are presently repeating the cycle described in this creed. I encourage you to read it in its entirety.

SESSION NOTES



Session thanks all who attended the January 8th Listening Meeting to hear our pastors explain why they are recommending the co-pastor model of pastoral leadership for our church and how they think this is in the best interests of the church. Over 100 people attended the meeting. Information on job responsibilities and the financial impact of this change was presented by the Personnel and Stewardship & Finance Committee chairs. The chair of the Governing Bodies Relations Committee explained the process, including approvals required by the Presbytery and by active members of the congregation. Session expects to call a special Congregational Meeting on or after April 2nd to vote on the proposal. A super majority (75%) approval by secret ballot is required for the proposal to go forward for final Presbytery approval. At its meeting on January 9th, Session voted to ask the Presbytery Committee on Ministry to give their approval to continue the process and to authorize the Congregational Meeting.

Other Session business on January 9th included welcoming the incoming deacons and elders who have begun their terms of office. The new officers were installed and ordained at worship services on January 22nd.

The annual Congregational Meeting on January 29th provides the congregation the opportunity to receive the Annual Report, approve salaries for the pastoral staff, and approve other items and appointments.





Run With the Horses: A Quest for Life at its Best, a Study of the Book of Jeremiah – February 12, 19 and 26

*We long to live life at its best – to fuse freedom and spontaneity
with purpose and meaning. Why, then, do we often find our lives so
frantic, so full of activity, but still devoid of fulfillment?*

*How do we learn to trust, to pursue wholeness and excellence –
to run with the horses in the midst of life?*

I think far too often when we read the Old Testament, we think of it as stories of the people long ago, stories we've heard since we were little children, and not much more. We need to be reminded that the Old Testament is not only a collection of stories from the past. We need to be reminded that the Old Testament, along with the New, are the Living Word of God! They speak to the family in the Philippines, those in concentration camps during the holocaust, a church in Scotland, refugees running for their

lives, and individuals in Webster, New York. The Bible is good for all times and places, and for all kinds of people. Through the eyes and insights of Eugene Peterson, the author of *The Message* translation of the Bible, we will hear and discuss the words of Jeremiah for the people of God today.

“In Peterson’s reflections we will ponder anew what it means to be fully and genuinely human” as we live faithfully according to the Holy Scriptures, as followers of Christ. “Filled with humor and self-revelation, his writings help to set the course for us in the quest for life at its best.”

Please come – young people and adults! If you can't make every class, come anyway! Let us learn together and from each other.

I am considering purchasing copies of the book for this study. Please consider attending, and let me know if you might like a copy of the book.

Last month we highlighted a couple of selections from our Bible Study section. This month, I have a few more suggestions from the library's Bible Study shelves. These could be used for personal devotional time, small group study, or devotions for a meeting.



First is *Faithfulness: The Surprising Key to a Life of Joy and Meaning* by David Bruce Linn, a pastor who at one time lived in Rochester. He structures his Bible lesson around a fictional story of a WW II soldier and a MASH nurse. These meditations have a direct application to our daily life battles. Rev. Linn seems to know how to make a personal connection with his messages.


