RISE AGAINST HUNGER

On September 30th youth and congregational members will work with Rise Against Hunger, an International Hunger Relief Organization, to package meals from 4-6 pm. Packages contain dehydrated, high protein and highly nutritious meals that are distributed worldwide. We had so many willing participants over the last 2 years that the church budgeted funds, and thanks to the generosity of a church member, the \$5,825.52 needed to fill 20,088 packages at the meal packing event has been raised.

What can you do to help? We need 8-10 youth volunteers to set up at 2:30 pm. and an additional 30 volunteers at 4:00 pm to fill bins with raw ingredients, scoop ingredients into meal bags, weigh & seal the bags, box and stack them on pallets, load the pallets, take down packaging stations & load equipment onto a truck. All members of the church are encouraged to work alongside the youth for this worthwhile mission. Last year's participants' ages ranged from 3 to 95. There is a job for everyone!

Starting School

Have you ever given any thought to the beginning of “school” for the disciples? After his baptism and time of temptation in the wilderness, both preparations for ministry, Jesus calls the first disciples. Different Gospel writers share different perspectives on the process of being called. Matthew and Mark are identical and very brief. Jesus passes by the Sea of Galilee and these guys are busy fishing. Jesus calls them, invites them to follow him, and they drop everything and follow. Luke is a bit more detailed. In Luke the disciples were cleaning their nets after having fished all night. Jesus climbs into a boat and asks these fishermen to take him out into the deep water to fish, after a night of catching nothing. You may remember the story. These fishermen are experienced, and this guy, who they don’t know, by the way, and who knows nothing about fishing, tells them what to do. For some reason (the Holy Spirit?) they agree, and as the story plays out, they catch so many fish that both boats are filled and they begin to sink. How flabbergasted they must have been! That’s their introduction to their new “school teacher.” After such a dramatic experience, they eagerly follow this man.

Really, what do they know?

When I think of children starting kindergarten, middle school, high school, college, really, what do they know? There is an eagerness and anticipation, excitement and fear. I imagine that the disciples experienced those same feelings. They had no idea what kind of “ride” they were in for.

We might say the same as the new church season begins. What do we know about what lies ahead this year - what kind of “ride” we are in for?

But if we look back at this past year and all the blessings, all the things we have learned as a congregation, all the ways God has led us to serve using our gifts and talents, surprising us over and over again, in good and hard things, we know this rabbi-teacher that called those first disciples.

Those first disciples were often confused. They were amazed and astonished so many times, it would make your head spin. Imagine those talks along the way, walking with Jesus, sitting at his feet, hearing his stories, seeing those miracles. Imagine those experiences of a life-time.

All those things describe us, too. Jesus walks with us. We “sit at his feet,” in Bible studies, worship services - hearing his stories, seeing his miracles. In a strange sense, we too are “starting school” again, and Jesus is our rabbi-teacher.

As we anticipate all that this new year holds, let’s hear those last words of his invitation when he called the disciples. Jesus said, “Don’t be afraid!”

Philippians reminds us that God will complete the good work begun in us. So, let’s pray hard, put ourselves “out there,” trusting that even though we don’t know what kind of “ride” we are in for, we have the best rabbi-teacher imaginable, and we need not fear!

Hang on! The ride begins! Let’s eagerly follow.

During the week of July 30th – August 3rd, our church was filled with the excitement of 86 children attending our Vacation Bible School program, “**Shipwrecked – Rescued by Jesus.**” There were 52 families attending which represented 13 different churches from around our community, including 14 families from WPC.

The week was only possible because of the 21 adult volunteers and 14 teen helpers who set aside 3 hours each day to be part of this outreach program. Classrooms were turned into tropical islands, beaches and shipwrecks with music, laughter and excitement filling the air. The music for the week was wonderful, with uplifting words of faith, encouragement and the love of Jesus for all of us. Our mission project was through World Vision. Donations were given by our VBS families to help purchase vegetable seeds for families in Haiti. A total of \$823 was given!! What a true blessing that is. Thank you to everyone who contributed to this year's success by volunteering your time, energy and money.

It's never too early to consider being part of our next VBS adventure next July. Talk to anyone who was part of the week and they will tell you it is well worth the time given.






“Someone You Love Is Living with Dementia. What Now?”

She also explains why and how she’s changed the way she talks about racism.

We will spend four weeks together as we study on September 30 and the first three weeks of October. In the second class on October 7, Hezekiah Simmons, our past Moderator of the Presbytery, will lead the class as we learn about this topic from the life and experience of a black man. 
