

STEWARDSHIP & FINANCE

HELP WANTED: Many of you know that Bob and Jan Rich will be moving out of the Rochester area in 2020. Our church family will miss them in so many ways.

They will leave a big hole in our church's financial operations. Both Bob and Jan have served on the Stewardship & Finance Committee for many years, and we welcome new members to join the committee in 2020. We meet on the 2^{nd} Thursday of each month.

More importantly, Jan has also been the **Church Treasurer** for some time, and we need to replace that position. The job has three main responsibilities:

- 1. Payroll: liaison between the Church and Paychex, our payroll processor;
- 2. Mission: planning, processing and reporting the mission part of the budget;
- 3. Financial control: account reconciliations, investment accounts, contributions to and disbursements from the Endowment, Memorial and other special funds.

As you can see, these really are 3 distinct responsibilities. We're looking at ways to reorganize to involve different people for each – it's not necessary for any one person to step up for all three responsibilities. In fact, we already have a volunteer for the mission responsibilities – but the mission committee could still use new members, including someone to learn this job for the future.

Finance and accounting backgrounds are not needed. The main requirements are good organizational skills, communication, a balanced perspective on the church's total financial picture, and the ability to maintain good documentation.

Are you good at coordinating with outside vendors? Please see one of us about the payroll job.

Do you have a heart for mission and want to learn more about the programs we support? Please see us about helping on the mission committee.

Do you have experience with bank and investment accounts? Please consider the financial control responsibilities.

We really need your help. Please prayerfully consider how you can help in one of these areas. You can talk to Jan Rich, Don George or any other member of the S&F committee for more details.
