In light of the challenges that we are facing with the COVID-19 virus, this is a special edition of the *Pathway*, bringing you the information you need to know while church services and activities are temporarily suspended and many of us are sequestered at home. We are sending out the *Pathway* digitally and mailing it to members who we know do not have email. Even if you do have email, if you need a printed version, just call or email the office and we'll drop one in the mail.

The Church Office will be staffed on a limited basis to receive emails (preferred) and return your phone messages: (585-265-9700 and office@websterpres.org and kboard@websterpres.org). We will also be emailing special announcements and prayer requests, so be sure to check your email frequently.

Once services and church activities resume we will send out another edition of *The Pathway* that will include the usual announcements about all the opportunities for spiritual growth, fellowship, and service that take place at Webster Presbyterian Church, and when and where they will take place.

Congregational Care Check-in Groups: The congregation has been divided into Check-in Groups. Each group has been assigned an Elder or a Deacon who will be in touch by phone with the people in their groups. The purpose is to care for one another in our church family during the pandemic through sharing, prayer, and identifying specific needs. When Jesus was asked, "Of all the commandments, which is the most important?" Jesus answered, "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind and with all your strength. The second is this: Love your neighbor as yourself. STEWARDSHIP: WHAT ABOUT MY PLEDGE WHEN THE CHURCH IS CLOSED?

We are in the early stages of a national health emergency. Although this is not primarily a financial emergency, people will experience financial hardships as the economic dislocations continue. It will be important to continue to meet our mission obligations as the organizations we support figure out how to continue their missions. In addition, most of our own costs will continue even when the building is closed. In other words, your financial pledge is as important now as it is when the church is open.

If you are experiencing short term financial hardships during the emergency, the church has some capability to help in some situations – please contact the office or Reverend Davis as necessary.

But if you are able to continue your pledge, how do you give when the church is closed?

Option 1 – US Mail

Some of us still remember things like envelopes and stamps (ask your parents) – you can always mail a check to the church office. Although the office is operating on irregular hours, we are checking mail, email and telephone messages regularly.

Option 2 – Online bill pay through your bank

Most banks offer some form of online bill payment. If you use this feature, you should be able to set up the church as a Payee, and make payments that way. You can make individual payments, regular weekly payments, or regular monthly payments for no fee to you, the donor, or to the church. See your bank website for details.

Option 3 – Online giving through the web site

Our new church website will be live in April, at **WebsterPres.org**. Once the new site is available, you will be able to make online payments to the church for a small fee to the church. Details are at the end of this article.

Option 4 – QCDs through your investment institution*

Are you over 70 ½ years old, and do you have a traditional IRA? Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) transfers are even more advantageous after the 2018 tax law changes increased standard deductions and fewer people are itemizing. Persons 70 ½ and older can distribute up to \$100K/year to charities from a Traditional IRA by filling out a QCD withdrawal form with their IRA provider.

QCD distributions are not taxable income, yet count toward one's annual RMD (Required Minimum Distribution) required of IRA investors after they reach 70 ½. (Of course, you can't "double dip" by including the QCD amount if you itemize deductions.)

QCD checks are made payable to the church and, depending on the practices of your financial institution, may be sent directly to the church.

Option 5 – Stock gifts through your investment institution*

Do you have appreciated stock that you wish to donate? (Timing may be bad for this one, but it might still apply in some cases.) Gifts of Appreciated Stock can be made via a signed form from one's broker, and may provide tax advantages to the giver. Please check with your financial institution and the church office for step by step instructions. Make sure to advise WPC secretary Georgia Hubbard so she won't have to guess the donor identity. If the stock value has depreciated, it may be advantageous to sell it, write a check to WPC for the proceeds, and take a tax loss to off-set gains from other transactions.

Stock transfers will typically be made directly from your institution to the church's account.




How to make online payments through the web site

1. Our new church website will be live in April, at **WebsterPres.org**. Once the new site is available, you will be able to make online payments to the church.

- 2. At the top right-hand corner of every page are two options. The lines are a drop-down navigation menu that can help you find specific pages you are looking for. The "Give" button will take you to the online giving section.
- 3. The page that opens up has two options "Give Now" or "Sign In". The "Sign In" option gives you an option to create a new account (or use an existing account) this will make future giving a bit quicker and easier. If you use other on-line services you are familiar with this process.



- 5. In either case, click the dropdown box titled "Choose a Fund" and pick where the money should go within the church. Your annual pledge should go to "General Budget" (which is currently the only one set up). Throughout the year, different funds will be available such as One Great Hour of Sharing, Blanket Sunday, and Summer Mission. Enter a dollar amount, and check the box for "recurring gift" if you want to. Then click on "Submit".
- 6. If you want the gift to <u>repeat</u> in the future, click the "Make This Gift Recurring" box. The system will then ask you to Register for an Account. If you do <u>not</u> want the gift to repeat, simply skip that box and continue down the page.
- 7. There are 2 options, again you can give by credit card or directly from your bank account. In either case, fill in the information requested and again hit "Submit."
- 8. You're done! You'll get an on-screen confirmation and an email confirmation.
