Recently, I attended an online gathering of some pastors in the Webster Community. The impacts of the COVID 19 Pandemic were discussed. We talked about how it impacted us individually, and what the town was experiencing. The police chief was present and said there have been a rise in domestic violence calls to the

police department since the start of the pandemic. If you or anyone you know is experiencing violence at home, do not hesitate to reach out to local law enforcement.

The pastors of the churches that maintain "Little Food Pantries" outside their churches (like a little book library, but with food) reported those pantries stay busy. The result of the rise in unemployment has caused MORE OF OUR NEIGHBORS TO BE HUNGRY. Jesus plainly says to each of us, "Whatever you do for the least of these, you also do unto me."

This week, I went to the market, purchased some food and placed it in the "Little Food Pantry" of another church. There is guidance that one should "not let the right hand know what the left hand is doing." I break that guidance to let you know I would have preferred to have put that food in a "Little Food Pantry" outside of the Webster Presbyterian Church on Webster Road. My prayer is for a "Little Food Pantry" near the road, by our church. Our local community needs it. If anyone wants to help, contact me.

Many thanks to our team of 7-9 people that organize and participate in the weekly service, some from their living room while others provide technical skills at the church.
