6. SCHOOL SUPPLIES COLLECTION DEADLINE IS TOMORROW for needy students at the Williamson Come-Unity Center and Eastern Service Workers. Collection boxes are located outside the north entrance to the church. Basic supplies that can be used at home like pencils, crayons, markers, glue sticks, colored folders, scissors, back packs and spiral notebooks are needed. For the class room, teachers have suggested the following items: Individual tissue packs, small individual water color paint sets, crayons in small boxes, chop sticks for music class, plastic Easter eggs to use as a rattle for music class, 2 gallon zip lock bags, and hand sanitizers.

Smaller packs (e.g. 24 count crayon boxes, 6 count pens or pencils, etc.) as opposed to very large packs are much preferred.

- 7. DISASTER RELIEF FOR LEBANON: The recent massive explosion at the docks in Beirut, Lebanon has created a huge humanitarian crisis. The Mission Committee is giving you the opportunity to contribute to this relief effort. If interested, please send a check to our church made out to WPC with the memo "Lebanon Disaster Relief," or you can do it online via the church website. Monies collected will be sent to Presbyterian Disaster Assistance who will distribute it to their first responder partners in Lebanon for food, water, medical supplies, temporary housing, and other basic needs.

Volunteers in those areas will receive the parts needed to assemble 3-4 of the toddler-sized wheelchairs for children in their communities with mobility needs.
