## ADULT CHRISTIAN EDUCATION

**Wednesday October 7<sup>th</sup>, 7:00 p.m.** via Zoom (check the bulletin the week before for the link) – Tony Hubbard will begin a Bible Study/Discussion entitled: *The Sermon on the Mount, What Does It Tell Us About Being a Christian?* The Sermon on The Mount can be found in Matthew, chapters 5-7. The first session will cover chapter 5 which includes the Beatitudes and other teachings on witnessing and the Jewish law. The study will continue in November after Sunday worship in the Sanctuary and via Zoom.



**Wednesday, October 21<sup>st</sup>** a speaker will join us on Zoom from Rochester Alliance of Communities Transforming Society, an “interfaith community organizing project of multi-racial, interfaith, urban and suburban congregations and groups that will train and

empower citizens to create systemic change and shape the political, social, and economic decisions that impact lives.”. SOCIAL JUSTICE, SYSTEMIC RACISM, BLACK LIVES MATTER and more are current headlines. How can we, a suburban, mostly white church, be involved in the Rochester community as it goes through turmoil and change? Be sure to mark your calendar as we seek to understand the turbulent times we are in and work for changes to bring Christian values and caring to our world.

**Sunday October 11<sup>th</sup>, 10:30 a.m.** after Sunday worship and via Zoom link (check the bulletin the week before for the link) – Join us to view the Adam Hamilton video “Where Your Treasure Is.” The video will be shown in the Sanctuary and as a continuation of the Zoom worship gathering. Adam Hamilton is senior pastor at the United Methodist Church of the Resurrection in Leawood, Kansas. The video and follow-up discussion will serve as an introduction to the fall stewardship program.



**Wednesday October 28<sup>th</sup>, 7:00 p.m.** via Zoom link (check the bulletin the week before for the link) - Glenna

Waller, President/CEO of Little Children of the World Inc., will join us from Georgia to talk about how this ministry to children in the Philippines and around the world is serving as the hands and feet of Jesus -- Sharing Love, Giving Help, Bringing Hope, and Changing Lives for so many. WPC has supported LCW/LCP as part of its annual mission budget for many years. Also, many individual members support LCW/LCP. This includes the soup kitchen started by Tim and Virginia Schutt of which we are the sole supporters, providing healthy lunches to 35-40 children at least five days a week. In addition, we send a small donation to provide a monthly birthday cake so that the children may enjoy a special treat, and WPC children have sponsored children through their Sunday School collections. Glenna Waller visited our church in 2013. Join us to welcome Glenna back and to hear how we can continue to support this ministry.

### GOOD BYE TO PAT

Goodbyes are often difficult, even when they are filled with new adventures for the person who is leaving! This summer WPC had to say farewell to our dedicated and talented organist, Pat Korenkiewicz, although, simply calling her our organist falls far short of all the contributions she has made to the life of our church.
