To my Sisters and Brothers in Christ

The journalist, Isabel Wilkerson, writes in her book, Caste: The Origins of Our Discontents:

"What scientists have only recently discovered is that ... earthquakes, those that are easily measured while in progress and instantaneous in their destruction, are often preceded by longer, slow moving, catastrophic disruptions rumbling twenty miles or more beneath us, too deep to be felt and too quiet to be measured for most of human history ... unseen stirrings deep in the earth's core."

The Webster Presbyterian Church has experienced an earthquake. This earthquake has been measured and reported on by committees. This earthquake has traumatized our sisters and brothers. This earthquake has fractured many relationships. Almost instantaneously the ground we stood on was changed.

Unacknowledged, however, are the long, deep and quiet rumblings in the life of our church family -- rumblings which are, essentially, decades of accommodation and acquiescence to longstanding cultural patterns, patterns which are *The Origins of Our Discontents*.

The lesson from earthquakes is, "when you build back, build back better." To that end, the Session has put in place a Healing and Reconciliation Steering Committee tasked with exploring and sharing the resources needed for our church to rebuild and to heal. This is the peoples' work. All are welcome to be a part of this effort.

Some receiving this letter believe it best for them to part ways with the Webster Presbyterian Church. I understand the strong emotions (gases if you will) this earthquake has unleashed. It could not be any other way. You likely have found yourself asking, "How can I worship and relate to people who have felt such different experiences of pain than I?"

I believe another question is in order. "What does faith in Jesus Christ looks like?" My Bible has taught me this -- God was reconciling the world to himself in Christ, not counting people's sins against them. And he has committed to us the message of reconciliation. Reconciliation is central to the work of God's earthly church. It is central to the living of our faith, and the Webster Presbyterian Church has embarked on a focused effort of Healing and Reconciliation.

During my tenure as Stated Supply Pastor, my intent is for the Webster Presbyterian Church to become known as a church that is safe, welcoming those who seek healing through Christ Jesus, and a church committed to the message of reconciliation. Our doors and our hearts are open.

LOOKING A HEAD TO 2021



Our budget planning is now complete for 2021. We've received pledges from 90 members or families with a total pledge of approximately \$332,000. A big thank you to

everyone who has pledged to support the mission and ministry of our church next year.

Session has approved the following budget for 2021. The reduced pledges will, of course, require a corresponding reduction in our spending. Some of the key decisions made include:

- We are only funding a single minister;
- We will be operating with a smaller staff and fewer hours;
- Mission spending will need to be significantly reduced;
- We have minimal operating reserves, and major project spending will be "pay-as-you-go;"
- Program and general operating spending will be kept under a tight control.

At the same time, we identified two incremental investments that we feel are critical to ongoing operations: funding programs for healing and reconciliation, and an upgrade of the office IT infrastructure.

We presented additional details in the Adult Ed. program on November 22nd. Since then, year-end contributions and additional pledges for 2021 have made it possible to adjust some of the figures presented at that time. Session will consider budget changes recommended by the Stewardship & Finance Committee at their January meeting. The final budget will be presented to the congregation at the January 31st Annual Meeting of the Congregation.

We are very pleased that Pastor Phil Davis is becoming our Stated Supply Pastor as of January 1st, 2021. This is a 1-2 year transitional position designed to help our church heal and prepare us to call a permanent minister. (Before this, Pastor Phil was our part-time Temporary Supply Pastor serving month to month.)



Pastor Phil comes to us with considerable experience in interim ministry.

Over the last 15 years, he has pastored both Presbyterian and Baptist churches in the Rochester area, several of which were going through transitions. His work in these churches was highly regarded.

Christian ministry came as a second career for Pastor Phil. He started out working in information technology after graduating from Hunter College in NYC. Along the way, he felt a strong call to ministry and obtained his Master's degree from Union Theological Seminary in NYC to pursue that call.

He has been associated with both the American Baptist and Presbyterian denominations. Because of an agreement between these denominations, he is welcome to serve in both types of churches.

Pastor Phil is a single father of two college aged sons. He has been quite involved in their lives and activities as they have grown up.

We appreciate Pastor Phil's deep faith and welcome him (again)!



At the behest of Pastor Phil, a Healing and Reconciliation Steering Committee has been formed by the Spiritual Nurture Committee. Its purpose is to focus on ways to promote the healing and reconciliation of our congregation after the trauma that we have experienced this past year. It will have access to the \$1500 in the budget specifically earmarked for that purpose.

Pastor Phil has said, "Everyone needs to locate themselves in the trauma," believing that it could help congregants to think about their responses to the trauma, thereby getting to know themselves better. Rev. Jim Evinger, in his Adult Ed presentation on November 15, 2020, remarked that you can't put a time constraint on healing and reconciliation. It is the work of everyone in the congregation and its leadership. So it will take us as long as we need.

The Healing and Reconciliation Steering Committee (HRSC) is open to everyone who wishes to take part in its work of exploring resources and implementing programs that will help our church to heal and rebuild. Our membership thus far consists of Bob Rice, Connie Rice, Bob Blakey, Alissa Mayer, Barb Hach and Pastor Phil. Please reach out to us if you wish to join us. The HRSC will meet on the third Monday of each month at 7:00 P.M. via Zoom. The first meeting will be January 18th, 2021.
