In March, several Session members attended virtual meetings conducted by the Presbyteries of Genesee Valley and Geneva. The "Creating Healthy Boundaries" workshop, led by Reverend Dr. Janice Fitzgerald, was based on best practices of the FaithTrust Institute. The purpose of the workshop was to help pastors and church leaders understand healthy boundaries for our contacts within the church.



The "Congregational Learning Day" offered the opportunity for church officers to talk to leaders from other congregations about their programs and best practices.

At the March meeting Session discussed how we may re-start the New Beginnings program. The New Beginnings committee will be looking at how certain activities that were suspended in 2020 could be restarted in a modified form.
