FROM OUR HEALING AND RECONCILIATION TEAM

It has been a bit over a year since our church experienced the trauma that we are working to heal from today. At our Adult Ed Congregation Conversation on February 10th, the Healing and Reconciliation Team listened carefully to your responses to the two questions that our coach, Rev. Dr. Janice Lee Fitzgerald posed to you: What is making it difficult for you to move



on into the future? And what do you think that the Team needs to consider as they seek paths to help members of this congregation heal and reconcile? Your comments revealed to us that there remains a profound sense of loss and hurt, anger and sadness; but also, glimmers of hope, energy to seek forgiveness and to connect with one another, and the observation that we were a family before the trauma and we are still a family. On Wednesday, March 24th at 7:00 P.M. via ZOOM, we will meet with you again to further our conversation. In the meantime, we are reaching out to you personally, either by phone or by postal mail.

We are a resilient congregation. We have made the choice to heal. We have asked for help. We are facing our pain. Despite the combined trauma of losing both pastors and the COVID-19 pandemic, and thanks to the lay leadership of our church, we have continued our ministries: worship and music via ZOOM and in person, Adult Ed, Women's and Men's Bible studies, Small Groups, Circles, Heart and Hand projects, Meals on Wheels, donating winter clothing and food to Cameron Community Ministries, Williamson Come-Unity Center and Eastern Service Workers. Our Youth Fellowship continues to meet and serve with adult leadership. Our Sunday school staff reaches out to families with young children with activity bags and a newsletter. Our church office is a ministry in itself. New Elders and Deacons and Trustees have accepted the invitation to serve our church into the future. We are a resilient congregation!

And God has blessed us with Pastor Phil who has set before us the dream of "...becoming a church that is safe, welcomes those who seek healing through Jesus Christ, and a church committed to the message of reconciliation-where our doors and our hearts are open."

Clerk's Corner --



WPC began broadcasting our Sunday morning service via Zoom, Facebook and YouTube last spring when we were forced to stop in-person worship because of COVID-19. In the fall of 2020 we were able to resume limited in-person worship with restrictions. Thanks to a dedicated crew of technicians, Jay Petrino, Alissa Mayer, Don George, Dick Dodd, Todd Fargo, and a few youth and other members who have substituted, we have continued the virtual broadcast along with in-person worship. The equipment that the crew has been

working with was either what we already had or was borrowed. Session approved funds in the 2021 budget to purchase new equipment which should improve the quality of our virtual broadcast. We expect that the virtual broadcast will continue indefinitely.

In person worship attendance has been approximately 30 each Sunday while Zoom attendance has averaged around 40. The Sanctuary is set for 60 in-person worshippers with proper social distancing by individual, couple, or family group settings. We ask that you call the church office to let us know if you plan to attend by noon on the Saturday before worship. If you plan to attend most or every week, let the office know and you won't need to keep calling. We keep track of attendance so we can contact trace if needed

won't need to keep calling. We keep track of attendance so we can contact trace if needed. There has been no need to date. I encourage you to try in-person worship if you have not already. If you forget to call, come anyway, then check in with the usher so your name can be added to the list of attendees. There is room for more in-person worshippers. I hope to see you at church!
