Spring is here and with it we see all of God's splendor as the leaves come out and the flowers bloom!

This is also the time of year at WPC when we honor or remember those who have made a difference in our lives as Christians. On May 2nd and 9th we will be accepting donations in their names. Yellow Rose Sunday will be on May 16th when we will dedicate the gifts during the service.

All donations will go to the WPC Endowment Fund. Like the annual pledge, an endowment gift is a way to financially support the mission and programs of the church. Unlike normal pledges, an endowment gift is perpetual – the church retains the principal value of the gift, and each year just uses the interest income.

For over 30 years, the Endowment Fund has grown and WPC has reaped the benefits, using the proceeds for items such as choir robes, the grand piano, New Beginnings, and mission projects.

You can donate by using the Yellow Rose envelopes at church, by mailing in a check and noting that it is for Yellow Rose, or by clicking on the 'Give' button on the website and indicating that it is for Yellow Rose.

ONE GREAT HOUR OF SHARING OFFERING

We are pleased to report that a total of \$3805 was collected for this special offering in March and April. Thank you very much for your generous support of this very worthy cause!

EASTERN SERVICE WORKERS VAN REPLACEMENT PROJECT

From April 11th to 25th the Mission Committee reopened the project to help the Eastern Service Workers Association complete its fund drive to purchase a new food delivery vehicle. To date a total of \$10,805 has been collected. Of that amount, \$10,000 came from ESWA supporters who are not in our congregation and \$805 came from our WPC

members. When the new vehicle is purchased, the Mission Committee will report more details.

During the whole month of May on Wednesday evenings at 7:00 P.M. via ZOOM, Learning for A Lifetime will be hosted by the Healing and Reconciliation Steering Committee Team. We will be welcoming our Coach, Rev. Dr. Janice Lee Fitzgerald, who will present a series of four, one-hour sessions dealing with Healthy Boundaries Training, custom adapted by her from Healthy Boundaries Training for leaders of congregations. Each session will build upon the next, beginning with scriptural and theological understandings of boundaries and ending with the opportunity for our congregation to consider healthy expectations for ourselves and our pastoral leaders, lay and professional.

Janice received her training in this area from the Faith Trust Institute, a National, Multifaith, Multicultural Training and Educational Organization with global reach. Some Presbyteries require this training of their clergy every three years. A few of your Session members attended this workshop for the Presbyteries of Geneva and the Genesee Valley this year and found it very useful. We thought that in light of our history in 2020, it would be valuable to share this information with our congregation as part of our goal of healing and reconciliation at Webster Presbyterian Church and fulfilling our dream "...of becoming a church that is safe, welcomes those who seek healing through Jesus Christ, and is a church committed to the message of reconciliation, where our doors and our hearts are open." 

Coldwater House is an outreach of The Open-Door Mission that supplies housing for women with their children until the family is again able to live on their own.


At the same time we will stitch up a few more of our microwave cozies for special gifts.
