To my brothers and sisters of the Webster Presbyterian Church,

There have been numerous moments when the work of the Healing and Reconciliation Committee has inspired me. One such moment was the last meeting when church member Karen Stoddard led our period of devotion. As part of her devotion she shared something that was so appropriate to not just our healing, but to our maturing in faith as well. Here is that devotion in part:

"Human beings are such that life together always involves them in hurting one another in some way. People may want to disbelieve this, but even a brief exposure to real vulnerability will testify that it is so. In a desperate scramble to avoid this fact of life, people will remain distant and superficial with everyone. They will run to other churches or groups at the first sign of differences. They will clam up in a tight little shell that does not know how to cry...or laugh. Such a flight from reality is not life, but death...If we want life, we must be prepared to hurt and be hurt. We simply must make peace with this fact. Once we accept this as a true perception of "life together", we can exert our energies learning how to deal with it, rather than attempting to avoid it."



Healing and Reconciliation

After more than a year of diligent congregational work and personal study, with God's help, your Healing and Reconciliation Steering Committee (HRSC) Team has concluded that WPC is ready to begin the next step in the process leading to the formation of a PNC. At its regularly scheduled meeting on October 18th, via ZOOM, with each member having voice, we unanimously agreed that, "it is time". Our congregation will be required to do the background work necessary - a congregational self-study - to write its Mission and Ministry Statement. A professional transitional consultant may be engaged to assist in the study. In any case, John DeHority, our Presbytery Committee on Ministry (COM) liaison, will be at our side for guidance. A Mission Study Document/Report will need to be submitted to the COM for its approval to form a PNC. We humbly ask for your continued support and patience and prayers during this phase of our work, especially for the individuals, yet to be determined, who will be leaders in the effort. As one of our HRSC Team members reflected, "I am excited to find out what God has planned for us." Indeed!

As you may remember, the Spiritual Nurture Committee (SNC) became the HRSC to lead the of healing and reconciling work in our congregation. One of the ministries that has been ongoing is the "Memory Verse of the Month." This has been carried on through the efforts of just one of our members for many years. It is time to offer relief. Might someone of you in the congregation consider taking this over? You wouldn't have to join the committee, but just make this your ministry to WPC for a one year period starting in January 2022. Who can forget the disturbing scene at the Afghan airport of people trying to flee their country? Our first thoughts were "What can I do", "How can I help?"

The Catholic Family Center has already welcomed several families to the Rochester area and is in need of cleaning supplies.

Rachel, Naomi, and King Circles will be in charge of collecting donations from our congregation.

Starting November 1st, there will be a collection tub in the Narthex. Also, on November 14th, there will be a "Drive Through" from 1 to 4 pm. Enter on the north side and stop at the north door where someone will help you, then continue around the circle.



At this time, they are only accepting **Cleaning Supplies.** This is because their capacity, both storage and personnel, is very limited.

A Note from Session

Last month I wrote about approval for the use of our building by outside organizations. This month I am writing about updating church policies and procedures. This year, Session reviewed all church policies. This is not a particularly fun thing to do, but it is important. The Policies and Procedures Manual had not been totally updated since 2015. Certain policies such as sexual harassment prevention and child protective care are required to be updated at least every three years. A new policy for electronic meetings was prepared in 2020 because of the need to meet virtually. Other polices updated this year include use of our financial resources, church by-laws, building usage requirements, acceptance of non-cash donations, job descriptions for board members and other policies. A paper copy of the Policy and Procedures Manual is available for review in the church office or, if you desire to see a specific policy, please contact me and I will send you an electronic copy.

Children's Christian Education

Our first outreach project for **SHINE** took place on Sunday, October 24th. The children attending that day put together "Snack Bags" for 18 rabbits and 6 goats who call Cracker Box Palace



home. Cracker Box Palace is located in Alton, New York, overlooking Sodus Bay. The 624 acre farm is a not-for-profit, farm animal rescue shelter. It is home to over 300 surrendered, abused, abandoned, neglected, or retired farm animals. The animals are cared for by veterinarians and volunteers who work to rehabilitate, train and eventually adopt to loving homes. It is a no-kill shelter where the animal residents can spend the rest of their lives loved and in peace if their condition does not allow them to be adopted. Gwen Hoffman, (Gayl's sister) is a volunteer at Cracker Box. The treat bags for the rabbits contained carrots, lettuce, and a special bunny treat. The bags for the goats contained carrots and animal crackers! On October 27th, our SHINE Treat Bags were delivered with love and care to Cracker Box to share with Darius, Irwin, Gaston, and all of their friends.



Our project for November will be to pack "Blessing Bags" of trail mix which will be handed out by the **SHINE** children to people attending worship on November 21st.
