From Pastor Phil

Dear Church Family,

The opening words of the 46th Psalm are, "God is our refuge and strength, an ever-present help in a time of trouble. Therefore we will not fear." I don't know what gave rise to writing this Psalm, but something was happening in the life of the faithful that they needed the reminder, "God is an ever present help in a time of trouble."

In these days, something is always going on that makes us wonder what will come of our lives, our loved ones, the nation and the world that we live in? Faced with the concerns of life, we think that we should do something. We see our challenges as a call to action. With these wonders and concerns, the Psalmist steps into our lives and reminds us of many things, two of which I want to highlight. The first reminder is that God is ever present and ready to help. Yet, even with God's presence, we seem to think that we must pursue one course of action or the other. The worldly advice is "take the bull by the horns." And this is where the second reminder comes in. At the 10th verse of the 46th Psalm, on behalf of God, the Psalm tells us "Be still, and know that I am God." God is not saying, be still and do nothing. God is saying be confident that "God is our refuge and our strength, an ever present help in a time of trouble." No matter what we are facing, our task is to remain confident that the eternal God is facing it with us.

That is our task.

Healing and Reconciliation

Pending Session approval, your Healing and Reconciliation Steering Committee (HRSC) is dissolved. With God's help, we have worked for a year to deal with the hurt, the anger, and the grief resulting from our trauma of 2020. We have presented numerous programs and workshops and we have personally reached out to congregation. We have had the support and expertise of Rev. Anne Waasdorp, retired Presbyterian minister and recent former member of the Committee on Ministry (COM) of the Presbytery of the Genesee Valley. She also walked with the WPC Session during its 2020 deliberations. Thanks to Anne's recommendation, we engaged a professional coach, Rev. Dr. Janice Lee Fitzgerald, to assist us along the way. Janice recently commented: "I am so delighted at what the HRSC team has helped to bring about and believe firmly that it was because of the love of church family, dedication and Spirit-led inspiration that each of you brought to your tasks. It is a moment of important transition that you are no longer needed as a separate team but will continue to help lead the congregation back toward health from within the other roles you play in the congregation."

The time has come to move on to the next step of a congregational mission study which will result in a new mission statement for WPC. We will have the support of our current COM liaison, John DeHority. It requires the participation of the whole congregation, so please watch for the opportunities to define our church.



A Note from Session

Session has called an in-person congregational meeting for **Sunday**, **December 12th** immediately following the worship service. If possible, please plan on attending in-person worship that morning so you will have the opportunity to vote on the three business items on the agenda. In 2020 there were times when we were not meeting in person and therefore voting was done electronically. Now that the church has opened for more normal activities, church business can be conducted inperson.

The three items of business to be considered are:

- 1. Amending the church by-laws by
 - a) dropping the reference to the Associate Pastor.
 - b) changing the size of the church boards as approved by Session. Session is recommending that each of the three church boards be reduced in size by three members.
- 2. Amending the church electronic meeting policy/electronic voting policy as approved by Session. The revised policy enables the church to conduct business electronically when in-person meetings are not possible.
- 3. Nominate and elect church officers. We thank the Nominating Committee and those who have agreed to serve on our boards in 2022. The slate of officers will be presented at the meeting on December 12th. If you have any questions about these business items, please contact me.

Trustee's Corner

As of the writing of this Trustee message, the church is closed with the water turned off due to a dysfunctional sewer system. Gary Maier and John Wilbert along with Chamberlain Septic and Sewer have investigated with the Town of Webster the cause of backup of the church sewer. It seems that our lines have been disconnected from the Town main line at Schlegel Road. The Town has contacted the contractor who worked on the line a couple years ago. We anticipate that excavating will start Monday morning, the 22nd of November.

Once again, we are thanking the Scouts for their hard work in support of this church. They spent a few hours on Saturday, November 6, weeding the playground, raking, and picking up some of the leaves, sticks, and branches around the north side of the property. They were a big help with our outside chores.

The Trustees did extensive weeding and trimming on the south side of the building. Once the leaves are all down, gutters will be cleaned in preparation for winter.

And, yes, winter is coming along with snow and ice. If you notice that the walks are slippery, please, tell a Trustee or feel free to sprinkle the area with a little salt from the bin near the door.



WPC Financial Update

We really appreciate that people have been giving regularly and keeping up with their pledges. This has helped our income be at or above budget for this year. Expenses are near budget with many planned projects at or near completion. (Worship Streaming, Office Software/Hardware Upgrade, Social Room Floor, South Exterior Doors Replacement, for example.) This says that we should end the year about on budget. As of this writing, however, the cost to WPC of remedying the sewer back-up is not known and could affect the year-end result.

The Session decided to take \$11,000 from the Endowment to give to Mission. Mission funding

was significantly reduced going into 2021 because of the lower overall church budget. With this money, the Mission Committee can help more of the groups they support.

Looking ahead to 2022, we thank the congregation for returning their pledge cards in a timely way which is so helpful as we prepare next year's Budget. The Stewardship and Finance Committee now has the church committees' requests for next year's funds and will work to build the budget.
