Prayer of Confession

To build with God the Beloved Community seems impossible, and we grow weary. We cry, "Peace, peace," but there is no peace within us or around us. We find ourselves on the path of hatred and oppression, violence and war.

God has promised, "I will not keep silent and I will not rest until the vindication of my beloved people shines out like the dawn and their salvation like a burning torch.
