Mouser will be leading our congregation in a process to help us discern God's will as we begin the process leading to preparation of a WPC Mission Information Form and election of a Pastor Nominating Committee. Rev. Mouser is a teaching elder in the Genesee Valley Presbytery. He has extensive experience leading congregations during the transitional time leading toward the call of new pastoral leadership. The process will begin with small group meetings to which all members will be invited. Rev. Mouser has prepared nine questions that we will be asked to answer as part of the study process.

Mission Updates and Opportunities to Give

Special Giving Opportunity for December Tornadoes in Kentucky

In December and January, we received voluntary donations of about \$700 to assist in the recovery efforts from the December tornadoes in Kentucky and surrounding states. These contributions have been or will soon be forwarded to Presbyterian Disaster Assistance.

Christmas Joy Offering

We collected \$720 for this denomination-wide special offering in December and early January. These monies are split 50-50 between active and retired pastors and church workers with urgent financial needs, and with students of color at Presbyterian-affiliated colleges serving primarily students of color.

New Project at Grace House

Grace House, the transitional home for parolees that we support in Rochester, has initiated a project to greatly improve the appearance and comfort of the inside of their main residence building to make it look less institutional. The Mission Committee has approved our "adopting one of their large bedrooms". We are currently repainting the room and are using \$600 of mission money from the budget to pay for the paint and for new flooring and its installation. There may eventually be other ways that groups within our church can help make this room feel more like home.

Please consider helping the clients of Hope House, the Social Justice Ministry at 1450 Ridge Road in Webster.

Clients there have many needs and with higher heating costs for winter and the continuation of Covid, some items are just not in the budget. The following items are especially needed and can be dropped off at their location, directly next to Holy Trinity Church:

Body Lotion, Chapstick, Shaving Cream, Liquid Laundry Detergent, Coffee and Hot Chocolate, Cleaning Products, Mouthwash, Dental Floss, Spaghetti Sauce in a jar
