#### To my brothers and sisters of the Webster Presbyterian Church,

The Presbyterian Church, USA streams a podcast called: "A Matter of Faith: A Presby Podcast." On a recent episode, Akilah Hyrams, a Presbyterian fourth year medical student and preacher's kid, was interviewed by podcast hosts Simon Doong and the Rev. Lee Catoe. She was asked two questions.

"What's it like working in the medical and health field as a person of faith?" and,

"How does your faith inform the work you do and your perspective on the nation's health care system?"

I found her answers refreshing and I share them with you.

To the question, "How does your faith inform the work you do?" Akilah responds in part,

"You're working with God's creations. You're entrusted with their health and well-being. It's super humbling and a privilege to be called into the health field," because "it's God working through you to help people and heal people. To be honest, that's kind of rough. You are there for people's worst days as well as their best days. They can ask you super hard questions ... "

She continues,

As an adherent to the Golden Rule, Hyrams said she treats every patient she's seen during her medical training with respect, kindness and dignity, "... I try to take care of not just the body, but the mind and the spirit too.

She shares her perspective on the current state of the medical system saying,

"A lot of us aren't satisfied with the current system, me included. The current system values money over human life, and I'm not OK with that."

It is refreshing to hear a future medical doctor say,

"You're working with God's creations." and

"I try to take care of not just the body, but the mind and the spirit too."

My prayer is for all of us to see one another as "God's Creations" with concern for the "minds and spirits" of others.

I pray God will bless Akilah Hyrams to be a model for all medical professionals.

# A Note from Session

It has been almost three years since our church lost our co-pastors and lived through the worst of the COVID challenges. I ask the question, "Are we getting back to normal times?" Well, maybe. I am thankful that Pastor Phil Davis has been with us to lead worship and serve as a faithful teaching elder during this time. I am thankful that many of the elders who served in 2020 extended their terms of office to help us heal. I am thankful that many members have chosen to stay engaged to keep programs in the church going: Adult Ed, Mission, Christian Education, Youth Fellowship, Music and Worship, Personnel hiring new staff members, Stewardship and Finance managing financial resources, Trustees caring for the property, Deacons caring for members and fellowship, Heart and Hand, Bible Studies, and others not listed here. The Pastoral Nominating Committee (PNC) has started the search process for new pastoral leadership and has completed our Mission Identity Statement, the next step in the search process. We are seeking to live out our new identity statement:

#### We are followers of Jesus Christ, living and sharing the love of God through faith and action, welcoming all.

So, where do we go from here? The Nominating Committee is beginning to meet and seek officers to fill leadership positions for those whose term will expire in January. If you are contacted, please prayerfully consider how you can help WPC continue moving us toward normal and better times, continuing to do God's will in this community, as best we can.

# **Stewardship and Finance**

### 2023 Budget Update

At WPC, the budget for the coming year is put together in three steps. In the fall, the church committees are asked how much money they desire in the coming year. Then, after the Stewardship Campaign, the amount pledged is totaled. In the third step, the amount the committees will get is adjusted so that the total equals the amount pledged. This is finalized by year-end and results in the budget for the following year.

For 2023, the committees have reported how much they desire. The total is \$420K which is 3% higher than the 2022 budget. This is driven mainly by increased Personnel and Facilities expenses.

The Stewardship Campaign is underway for the 93 pledging units that we have.

We will report at the Annual Meeting at the end of January what the final 2023 budget is. We continue to appreciate the generosity of our congregation.

#### 2023 Budget Information

The committees of the church have submitted their requests for funds which creates the 2023 Budget. The table below compares the 2022 and 2023 Budget amounts. (Numbers are in dollars.)

\*Facilities are down for 2023 because extra funding was put into the 2022 Budget for the parking lot.

Once the 2023 pledges are totaled, adjustments will be made to the 2023 Budget to match the amount pledged. In 2022 there were 93 Pledging Units.

### **Parking Lot Funding**

We had reported before that most of the funding for repaving the parking lot was coming from endowments (\$183K) and from money budgeted in 2022 (\$35K). The congregation was asked if they could close the \$34K gap to make the \$252K project total. Donations of \$24K were received and \$16K was pledged! Any funds left over after the parking lot is done will be put toward future capital projects. We are so grateful for the continuing generosity of our congregation.

# **Mission Updates and Opportunities to Give**

### John Sankok from Kenya

#### Adult Ed Presentation, October 30th

On Sunday, October 30th, we will have the great pleasure of having John Sankok of Kenya visit our church and talk about his mission projects in Kenya during Adult Ed. Our mission teams to Kenya have visited John and his medical clinics at least 4 times, and we have supported his high school education project for Masai girls for many years in our church budget. These girls are otherwise "sold" to much older men in marriage at about age 12 if they don't go to high school. There will also be a **pot luck lunch** with John following the presentation – please call the church office if you haven't already signed up for that and want to attend.

A voluntary donation opportunity is available for anyone who wishes is to give an extra donation for John's girls education project. Please send or give your donation to Georgia, payable to Webster Presbyterian Church, and mark it as being <u>for</u> John Sankok by November 15th.

#### Winter Clothing Collection for Cameron

We are collecting gently used winter clothing for men, women and children until November 15th. Gently used and new winter clothing for men (especially needed), women and children can be place in designated bins in the Narthex. If you don't

have anything to donate from your closets, please consider going to Savers (Tuesdays - discount for anyone over 50), to Goodwill (Wednesdays discount for anyone over 55), or to any other store of your choice to buy men's clothing items.

### **Contributions for Hurricane Ian Relief**

In November, the Mission Committee will be sending a donation to Presbyterian Disaster Assistance to help with Hurricane Ian relief in Florida. If you would like to voluntarily contribute to this recovery, please make a donation to Webster Presbyterian Church by no later than November 15th and designate it for "Hurricane Ian relief".

### Highway Clean-up was Successful!

During the morning of Saturday, October 15th, an energetic group, including several new participants, picked up trash along Route 250 from Klem Road to Lake Road! Thank you to all who participated in this important semi-



annual cleaning! Our next evemt will likely be in April after the snow is gone.

### Kenya High School Students Fund

During September and October your donations to this fund totaled \$1830! You may make voluntary donations to this fund anytime during the year that you wish – be sure to designate them for "Kenya High School Students". Thank you so much to all of you who have already donated either this year or last year! We are currently sponsoring 5 high school students in Kenya and will now be able to add two more for the 2023/2024 school year!

#### Sponsoring a High School Student in Ethiopia!

Recently we became aware of a needy girl in Ethiopia via Amanuel, a man who had been a key contact for our Peacemaking Committee a few years ago to help them find appropriate African ministry students to receive funding from the Ngcokovane Scholarship Fund. Meti is a girl, a junior in high school, whose father was recently killed, and she had no money to continue in school. Praise the Lord the Mission Committee received a special gift for mission from an anonymous member during the summer and we were able to use part of that to pay for Meti's expenses to attend a boarding school for this school year!

#### **Cameron Community Ministries**

On Sunday, October 2nd, two staff members and two kids who attend the after-school program at Cameron Community Center in the northwest part of the city talked to us about their various ministries during Adult Ed. Their long time projects include the after school program for elementary school children, a daily lunch program, a food cupboard and a clothing house for their neighborhood. They also told us about some exciting newer projects such as an after-school program for high school students and a new computer/technology center for all ages.

### *Gift Cards for Christmas for Grace House*

Starting in later November, we will again be collecting \$10 gift cards for Christmas for the men living at Grace House, which now includes homeless men in addition to parolees. There will



be more details in the December Pathway and in the bulletins in late November. But as always, gift cards will be appreciated for basic items such as food, fast food, and stores like Target and Walmart.
