Trustees' Corner

New Trustees and Retiring Trustees

We want to welcome Scott Hewlett and Dan Marsh to the Board of Trustees for a 3 year term. And many thanks to Bob Kizer, Tina McNeary and Dick McNeary for all the hours and work they have done for WPC. Just remember that "once a Trustee, always a Trustee"!

The Boiler Project

The new 2-boiler system is in place and working great. We still have some control issues to sort out due to the switch from one system to another. We will then receive training because the new boilers have more functions than the previous system.

We have also signed a contract with Metro Group to monitor the hot water boiler loop. They have put cleaning agent into the loop to clean it. We then put in fresh water and drained out the dirty water. Once the water was tested and found to be clean, neutralizer was added into the loop. Metro Group will check the loop water to insure that it remains neutral by adding more chemicals as needed.

Pipe Organ Repairs

Parsons Organs is scheduled to begin the repairs necessary on the rank of pipes that have warped. This work is a rollover project from 2021 and 2022. The work is to start Monday, January 30th and be complete by Friday, February 3rd.

Winter Weather means ICE

Just a reminder that we all need to be aware of ice on the side walks and parking lots. There is salt just inside all the entry doors, so if it is slippery, sprinkle a little salt on them.

Mission Updates and Opportunities to Give

Adult Ed. Guest Speaker, Rev. Jim Crowley

Join the Mission Committee during Adult Ed. hour on February 5th as they present Reverend Jim Crowley, a semi-retired pastor who has worked with Saving Grace ministries for the past 18 years. He is currently the Director of Grace House which WPC has been supporting both financially and with volunteer help.

Men who are released to parole supervision come through Grace House's program each year. However, this year they have changed their policy to accept men who are homeless or disadvantaged in some way. Here they learn life skill training in housing, employment, money management, self-advocacy, responsible parenting, and decision-making to equip clients for long term success.

Blanket Sunday Offering

Our annual collection for the "Blanket Sunday" offering will be from Sunday, January 29th until Sunday, February 19th this year. Envelopes are in the chair racks. This offering is organized by Church World Service and collected by many churches nationwide. It provides not only blankets (for about \$10 each!), but also other essentials such as food, seeds, farming tools, etc. to impoverished and hungry people around the world. Christmas Joy Offering

The total donations to this annual offering, which assists current and retired pastors and church workers who have financial hardships and students of color at Presbyterian-related colleges, were \$820 compared to \$720 a year ago. Thank you!

On January 20th, Father Roman of the Ukrainian Catholic Church of the Epiphany visited our church to accept a gift of 18 children's "Care Bags" from Heart and Hand for Ukrainian refugee children.

Each bag included a variety of health care items, toy/game, story book, coloring fun, and a fleece hat & scarf set. Additionally, we gave Father Roman five special Ukrainian colored (bright yellow and blue) hat sets. Father Roman shared that 3,000 Ukrainian refugees arrived in the Rochester area within the past year. Pastor Phil suggested that we would appreciate a more lengthy visit to share some of their needs with more of the congregation.

Later in January, we will deliver over 30 fleece hats and scarves to the Open-Door Mission's Coldwater House for their homeless families.



Women's Bible Study

Week 1—DVD Lenten Series with Adam Hamilton

"Words of Life: Jesus and the Promise of the Ten Commandments Today"

Consider the day...the day that lies ahead ...just as it dawns...and as you rise to greet it...Consider the day with care...and perhaps when it has passed...you will be able to consider it well spent...and smile as one at peace.

Green Tip of the Month

Attics are the greatest source of home heat and cooling loss. Use enough insulation to go higher than the floor joists (about 12-15 inches thick). It can be rolls, batts, rigid boards, loose fill, or spray foam, as long as it is rated at R-38 or higher. Insulating hot water pipes can also save on water heating costs.
