A Note From Session

Two members of the Board of Trustees came to the December Session meeting to explain work that has been started at the request of Session to prepare an Emergency Action Plan (EAP). Trustees completed a survey of on-line and written materials on this subject for churches and did a walk around inspection of our building. While the probability of emergencies happening in the church is very low, we seek to keep all users of the building safe while keeping in mind our identity statement which includes the phrase "welcoming all." A committee of trustees, elders, and deacons will be formed in 2023 to develop this plan further with the goal of ensuring that the church is as much of a safe place as possible while continuing to be welcoming.

New church officers will begin their terms of service in 2023. If you are not already serving on a church board or committee, I encourage you to consider joining one of the committees that plans and conducts our programs. Members with ideas to help us plan and implement our programs are always needed. Trustees' Corner

The Boiler Project

During December, we have had two of our three boilers fail.

In the interest of keeping our Church warm for all, we are updating our boiler system. The three boiler system that is now in place had an expected life span of 15 years. The boilers are currently 14 years old.

We have signed a contract to install two high efficiency boilers to take their place. They will have the same BTU capacity as the old boilers, but will be capable to ramp up from 10% to 100% as the church needs heat.

The cost for labor, materials and boiler units is estimated to be \$63,000.

Money from the church's cash reserve will be used to pay the bill. Then we will need to replenish that \$63K which we are calling the Boiler Fund. To do so, we will be looking at the Operating Budget for savings and at the endowments for funds. There is also an opportunity for people in the congregation to contribute to the Boiler Fund.

Presbytery Collaborative Ministry Grant

In the fall of 2022, Session approved WPC's submission of an application for a Collaborative Ministry Grant. The Collaborative Ministry Grant is intended to encourage intentional partnerships that serve the people of our local communities in Christ-like ways, promoting God's works through community and relationships, especially in challenging times. These awards aim to promote ministry connections between the Presbytery of Genesee Valley congregations or neighborhoods with one or more community agencies, faith communities, or other local entity. These grants are intended to support true partnerships between those working together on a common ministry for God.

WPC's application has been submitted, approved and secured to partner with State Road Elementary School and use the \$1100 funds for supporting students and families through providing books and activities for school and home use, snacks and meals when needed, and chimes to support learning and emotional connectedness through the gift of music.
