The parking lot project is complete and looks great with bright yellow lines for the parking spaces.

Soil has been placed along the edges of the asphalt where there was a drop between the driveway and the lawn. Thanks to Gary Maier, Mark Pipal, Bob Kizer, Dan Marsh and John Wilbert.

Jean and Gary Maier painted Room 11 & 12 for the Heritage Christian group. The new paint brightens the rooms so they look like new again.

The two main speakers in the Sanctuary have been repaired and are now back to good working order.

Guards were installed over the fire alarm pull boxes to prevent accidental activation.

We have purchased thin gel strips that grip the floor as well as the carpet runners so they will stay in place without marking up the tiles. They will be put in place this fall as our weather changes to rain and snow.

We have addressed and repaired a loose seam that was the potential cause of water getting in and dripping on the Social Room ceiling tiles.

Mission Update

School Supply Collection

Thank You, Thank You, Thank You!

The Mission Committee is very thankful for the overwhelming generosity of this congregation for the many school supplies collected for Williamson Come-Unity Center and Eastern Service Workers. This year, more than 120 children will benefit from the backpacks and other school items we collected. A special thanks to the VBS children who donated many of the supplies, the women and three young children who helped pack the items, and to the drivers who delivered them.

It is such a blessing that we are able to help equip so many children with the proper tools to start school.

Summer Mission 2023 Update

Thank you for your wonderfully generous donations for our two Summer Mission projects for the citizens in Ukraine!! As of this writing on August 19th, we have exceeded our goal of \$8000 by more than \$900 with about two more weeks to collect! And as we have said before, exceeding the goal is just added blessings to the extremely needy people still in Ukraine!

As a reminder, we will be providing medical supplies via ROCMaidan, a nonprofit organization headquartered in Webster, and food boxes via Cru (formerly Campus Crusade for Christ), a national organization.

Kenya High School Students Fund

We are currently sponsoring 6 students who are graduates of the Thogoto Primary School in Kikuyu, Kenya (near Nairobi) for their high school years. We hope to add a 7th student in January, which is the start of the Kenya school year. High school in Kenya is costly for poor students and their families, and these students would not be able to attend high school without our support.

We will be offering you a chance to make a voluntary contribution to this ongoing fund in September and early October. Our goal is to collect \$5000 this fall so that we can continue this special project, not only next year but into the future. Please prayerfully consider making a generous contribution and deliver it or send it to the church office to the attention of Georgia by October 8th.

Wildfires in Maui

At its August meeting, the Mission Committee approved sending \$500 from its Discretionary Fund to the American Red Cross to support its disaster fire relief efforts in Maui. Anyone from the congregation who would also like to contribute to this cause, please bring or send your donation to the church office by mid-September.

Getting to Know You

A peek into the lives of our Friends at Home written by Dawn Wiley

To reach the age of 100, you must be made of pretty stern stuff for as they always say, "growing old is not for the faint of heart!" Marge Crumb will reach that milestone this year in mid-October and there will be a grand celebration at Webster Pres on the 15th from 2:00 – 4:00 p.m. Don't miss it!!

Marge comes from solid German roots and grew up right across the bay in Irondequoit. After high school, she worked as a secretary and later as a sales associate for Scheer's Jewelers. She met her husband, Duane, at a little matchmaking dinner hosted by her cousin who worked with Duane at Rochester Products. He was a mechanical engineer and a widower with two young daughters, Susan and Judy. According to Susan, Marge knew right away that "he was the one for her!" Duane and Marge were married in 1955 at the Lutheran Church of the Resurrection in Rochester and Marge moved into Duane's home in Webster where she lives to this day. Putting her career on a temporary hold, Marge handled becoming an instant mother with the strength and love that so typify her personality. A few years later, Duane and Marge welcomed another little girl, Terry, and their family of four became five. Sadly, the five Crumbs became four again when sister Judy passed away at the age of 16. As the children became more independent, Marge decided to return to work. Part-time at first, she was eventually able to fulfill a life-long goal of becoming an executive secretary when she began working for the Vice-Principal at Schroeder High School. Her sympathetic connection to the children was very obvious as she kept a bowl of candies on her desk to help reduce their anxiety when being called in to talk to a principal! Always a people-person, Marge volunteered at Red Cross blood drives, helped at the polls for local elections, counseled breast cancer survivors, and was a member of the West Webster Volunteer Fireman's Exempt. At WPC, she was a member of the choir, a deacon, and up until COVID, continued to help with refreshments for memorial receptions.

Duane and Marge enjoyed trailer camping with the family and were members of the SuNCHAasers Chapter of the National Campers and Hikers Association. Their favorite trip, however, was in 1970 when they visited Oberammergau, Germany to see the Passion Play. (I must admit, I had to look this up. I'd heard of it, but never really knew the history. It has been put on by the villagers of this Bavarian town every ten years, with the exception of during the World Wars, since 1634 in thanksgiving for the end of the Black Death.)

In 1997, after 42 years together, Duane passed away. In 2017, Terry moved back to her family home to care for Marge as she began to face the challenges of aging. Anything left on Marge's bucket list? According to Terry, she thinks she'd like a puppy (Terry's not sure how the two cats would feel about that!) Her favorite things? – puppies, kittens, flowers and kisses! Who can argue with that?

According to Marge, her secret to her longevity is keeping her sense of humor and her faith in God. I believe she would like people to remember her for having lived an active life, full of Christian values of service to others and ultimately that she was a good person. I have no doubt, when the time comes, surely that will be her legacy.

Get Ready... Get Set... GO!! It's time to SHINE for Jesus! We will begin our new Sunday morning SHINE class for children PreK-5th grade on Sunday, September 10th at 9:30!



We are excited to welcome all of our SHINE kids back for another school year of Bible lessons, crafts and mission outreach projects. Mrs. Anderson will once again be working with the kids, teaching them to play both the chimes and the colored handbells. There will be many opportunities for the kids to perform during the morning worship services. Mrs. Brocker and Mrs. Galen will be teaching the Bible lessons and craft projects.

Our morning schedule remains the same with all kids attending worship with their families at 9:30.
