This is to help the first responders quickly locate emergency issues within the building. We have sent a map of our building to Webster police and fire the departments showing the labeling of these exits in addition to smoke and fire zones.

In addition, three signs have been placed outside indicating our emergency gathering points. One sign is located outside the west entrance by the Church sign by the road. The second sign is straight out from the South entrance at the south side of the parking lot. The third sign is located straight out from the exit from the basement rooms by the woods. Please take a few minutes to locate them the next time you are in the building.

Mission Update

Summer Mission Finale!

Thank you for your wonderfully generous donations totaling \$9373 for our two Summer Mission projects for the citizens in Ukraine! We have sent about half of this total to Cru (formerly Campus Crusade for Christ) for them to purchase boxes of food for needy families in rural areas of Ukraine. And we have donated about half to ROCMaidan, whose headquarters are in Webster, to purchase about 22 backpacks full of medical supplies for nurses, medics, and other skilled medical personnel to treat the many wounded citizens in Ukraine. Several members of the Mission Committee recently visited ROCMaidan's warehouse off Phillips Road in a Xerox building to see their facility and help pack several of the medical backpacks.

Kenya High School Students Fund

We are currently sponsoring 6 students who are graduates of the Thogoto Primary School in Kikuyu, Kenya for their high school years and hope to add a 7th student in January, the start of the Kenya school year. High school in Kenya is not free and is cost-prohibitive for poor students and their families. These students would not be able to attend high school without our support.

We are asking for your voluntary donations from now until early October. Our goal is to collect \$5000 this fall so that we can continue this special project, not only next year but into the future. Please prayerfully consider making a generous contribution and deliver it or send it to the church office to the attention of Georgia by October 8th. Special envelopes for your gift are in the chair racks.

"Give" Button Electronic Alternative

Did you know that when you use a credit card (as in the case of our website 'Give' button), the card company charges a processing fee to the organization or business being paid? This is usually around 2 - 5% of the amount of the transaction. We are very happy that people use the WPC website 'Give' button, but wanted to let you know that our church paid over \$1,000 of these fees last year.

There is an alternate way to pay electronically that does not use a credit card. It is by using the 'Bill Pay' option as part of your online banking. When using this option, you enter what organization you want to be paid, the amount and date for the payment to be made, and press 'Pay'. It is easy and there are no fees associated with this.
