

#### Invitation

Pastor: As we come to this table, we are reminded that this is the

table of Jesus Christ, a banquet prepared for everyone. All who seek to be nourished and sustained in the journey of faith, all who seek wholeness and compassionate paths to

Pastor: Blessed are you, Breath of peace, Giver of all life, Source

of love that knows no boundaries. Your song of wisdom rang out before the world began; throughout the ages, your song of liberation has impregnated us with your hope for a world where: those considered last and least are first and most; violence is overcome by the power of your ancient

love; and all siblings work together for peace.

You bring our longing to birth and send prophets to awaken us to your approaching Advent among us. We thank you for those who, like Mary, have the strength and courage to give birth to your love in the world; for those who, like the shepherds, dare to seek out the Child of Bethlehem; for those who, like the wise ones, actively challenge violent and oppressive powers.

We praise you that your everlasting light is shown to us in womb and tomb, in cradle and cross, in tenderness and compassion. We join in the Advent prayer of all your people, "O come, Emmanuel." And as we wait and watch for your coming among us, we proclaim your goodness.

Pastor: And now, lest we believe that our praise alone fulfills your purpose, we fall silent and remember him who came because words weren't enough. Setting our wisdom, our will, our words aside, emptying our hearts and bringing nothing in our hands, we yearn for the healing, the holding, the accepting, the forgiving which Christ alone can offer. Merciful God, send now, in kindness, your Holy Spirit to settle on this bread and cup and fill them with the fullness of Jesus. And that same Spirit rest on us, converting us from the patterns of this passing world, until we conform to the shape of him whose food we now share.

#### **Words of Institution**

Pastor: Among friends, gathered around a table, Jesus took bread, and broke it, and said, "This is my body – broken for you." Later he took a cup of wine and said, "This is the new relationship with God made possible because of my death. Take it, all of you, to remember me."

People: Amen, Amen, and Amen.

Pastor: He whom the universe could not contain is present to us in this bread. He who redeemed us and called us by name

now meets us in this cup. So take this bread and this cup. In them God comes to us so that we may come to God. All

is prepared.

You will receive the elements in your seats today.

When you receive the bread, hold it so we can all partake together at the same time. Please do the same with the cup after you receive it.
