Dear WPC Family,

Are you a New Year's resolution type of person? I find myself in a reflective place with the passing of the new year, but find that I am less and less inclined to make a resolution. A Note from Session

The Year in Review

2023 has been a year of change for Webster Presbyterian Church. The Pastoral Nominating Committee completed its search and brought us Reverand Nadia Mullin as our new pastor and head of staff. We said goodbye and thanks to Pastor Phil Davis for his service as we made our transition to new pastoral leadership.

We continued a strong mission program with over \$9,000 collected to assist two groups that support humanitarian efforts in Ukraine.

Bible studies and book clubs continued.

The Trustees completed major projects including the new parking lot, two new boilers, and a new office copier using member donations and investment funds.

The New Beginnings Program, which had been on hold since pre-COVID, started a reading program at State Road School and promises that more activities will start in 2024.

Sadly, we decided to suspend the Youth Fellowship program because there were too few youth participating in the good programs offered by Youth Director Wanda Nungesser. More children are coming to the SHINE program on Sunday mornings. Hopefully these children can become the future of a new youth Sunday School and fellowship program.

We are seeing more visitors coming to worship with us since Pastor Nadia has started her ministry at WPC. So, in 2023 we have much to be thankful for and we look forward to 2024 with hope that we can expand our ministry in Webster and beyond.

Trustees' Corner

As the end of 2023 comes to a close, we have been blessed. God has blessed us with talented people in the congregation to provide invaluable work on our building, and he has blessed us with the financial wherewithal to complete some rather large projects. Please accept our sincerest appreciation for the support you have provided.

As we enter the winter season, PLEASE BE CAREFUL!!!! Our new parking lot is now smooth and could be slippery. The ruts and crack no longer break up the ice. We ask that you be extra vigilant as we break in the new parking lot.

We have purchased a new copier for the office. Our old copier has served us well for many years – too many years. It could no longer be repaired. The new copier should be in place by the first of 2024.

Over the next year, we will be upgrading our internet to Frontier's new fiber-optic system. This will greatly increase our bandwidth to allow faster streaming. It will also take the place of our existing phone system. The best part: it will cut our telecommunications bill substantially. We are working with Frontier to get the service up and running – stay tuned for updates.

We continue to do small repair jobs around the church including replacement of missing shingles, minor roof leaks, and minor plumbing repairs. If you see an issue that needs attention, please reach out to one of the Trustees.

"Polite inclusion is the gateway drug to mercy." So says Anne Lamott in her book, Hallelujah Anyway: Rediscovering Mercy.

The large attendance and your positive comments at our November 2023 Adult Ed program: "What Does 'Welcoming All' mean?" were very encouraging. We were exploring the phrase that ends our Identity Statement: "We are followers of Jesus Christ, living and sharing the love of God through faith and action, welcoming all." Here at WPC, we have shown that we welcome the handicapped (we are handicapped accessible with our ramp leading to the Chancel, and the lift from the Narthex to the upper level); we welcome the developmentally disabled (our church is used every weekday by Heritage Christian Services.) It doesn't even occur to us to discriminate on the basis of race or color! Our iNclusive Exploration in Christ Committee is focusing on ways to also welcome our LGBTQIA+ siblings. To that end, we will be exploring options for our website, making our church more visible in the community, having more congregation conversations. Perhaps one day we will live in a world where we won't have to define people by groups! Please keep us in your prayers and share your thoughts and ideas with us, if you wish. Thank you.






