

Service of Holy Communion

Invitation

Pastor: Arise and Shine! God's love is here! Arise and Shine! God's love is born again, for you and for me, for me and for you! So a star was placed in the sky to announce the Good News of the Lord's love born into this world. So a star was placed in the sky to shine and let the people know. The one in the sky and the one born that night, who grew to be guite a light to follow, indeed. And all these years later, God has set some sort of star on each of our paths, calling us here, to be together, and to be with God. So, arise! Follow! Come close! Look around! And shine. Your light is come!

Pastor: The Lord be with you, People: And also with you. Pastor: Lift up your hearts.

People: We lift them up to the Lord.

Pastor: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. People: It is right to give our thanks and praise.

Pastor: We give you thanks and praise, O God, because we know your story of love. Words of Institution

Friends, let us shine, and live in the light of the Lord.
