Trustees' Corner

church fall workday November 9th. A big thank you goes out to all that helped make it a great success. We washed windows, got the snow blower ready for winter, put salt by all the doors, and cleared all the gutters and roofs of leaves. We inspected all the chairs for ripped seats and broken parts and cleaned all the halls with an extra tall Swiffer to remove all the cobwebs and dust. We finished making repairs on the cracks the south sidewalk. The air conditioner was covered and leaks were cleaned up all around the church. The Narthex was given a deep clean and the exhaust fan above the pastor's office was repaired.



Weber Tree Service has cut down the 10 large dead ash trees plus removed the large tree branch that hung over the path to Respitewood. We are very grateful for their generous donation.

Finger Lakes Roofing has repaired the Social Room roof. They did return to do a second repair after it rained and a second leak was found. We are crossing our fingers that all leaks have been repaired, but we will need it to rain before that question can be answered.



A Note from Session

At our November Session meeting, we formed a subcommittee to prepare a job description and terms of call for a stated supply minister to lead us as we seek a new minister. Interviews for that position have started. The stated supply minister will be under contract to serve us while we form a Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC) and search for a new full-time minister. The PNC will be using the Mission Study that was prepared in 2022 as updated to prepare a list of characteristics that we are seeking in a new minister. If you are interested in being part of that process, please talk to Todd Fargo, Kathy Barbehenn, or myself. In the meantime, Heather Hewlett, chair of the Worship and Music Committee, has recruited visiting pastors to lead worship until we hire a stated supply minister. Rev. Phil Davis was our stated supply minister from January 2020 until Pastor Nadia began her ministry at WPC in August 2023. Many people are continuing to keep our programs for children, youth and adults going at WPC as we seek to bring God's word to people in our community.

WPC is part of the Presbyterian Church USA (PCUSA). As of 2022, there were over 9,300 PCUSA churches. The PCUSA provides resources for churches. The constitution of the church has two parts, The Book of Confessions and The Book of Order. These documents include confessions that have been part of church history and provide guidelines for the mission of the church, form of government, directory of worship, and rules of discipline. If you want to learn more, both documents can be downloaded at the PCUSA website. I bring this up because Session is charged with following the guidelines prescribed by the national church. Two requirements for all PCUSA churches are to have policies for Prevention of Sexual Misconduct and Child and Youth Protection. These policies were developed by Session committees and are part of a set of policies available for review in the church office or, if interested, I can lend you my copy. A new requirement for PCUSA churches is preparation of an antiracism policy. Session reviewed policies already in place by the PCUSA and our local Presbytery of Genesee Valley (PGV) and has developed the statement shown below which we think complies with the new PCUSA requirement.

The policy is: Racism is the opposite of what God intends for humanity. It is the rejection of the other, which is entirely contrary to the Word of God incarnate in Jesus Christ. Racism is also a lie about our fellow human beings, for it says that some are less than others. Webster Presbyterian Church stands against racism and will seek opportunities to educate our congregation and staff in how to recognize and address racism in our lives. We will also conduct antiracism activities including speakers, listening sessions, book discussions, and field trips. This training and these activities will be conducted following the guidance of the Presbytery. All persons shall be treated as beloved children of God.

We expect there will be opportunities in 2025 to discuss this further with the congregation. In the meantime, if you have any comments for Session, please contact me.
