

Sermon Study Questions July 27th


- Contradictions: Two weeks ago, we read Isaiah 56:1-8 about God's envisioned inclusion of "foreigners" and "eunuchs." At the time, I suggested that I wasn't sure this was actually implemented. Today, we read from Nehemiah.
 - A. How did you feel after hearing this text read?
 - B. Nehemiah seems pleased with himself...he asked God to remember him for good. What do you think about Nehemiah's actions?
 - C. Flip the story around. If you had been one of the Jews who had "intermarried," how would you feel at having to be "cleansed?" How about the son of Jehoiada who was "chased" away?
 - D. Can you see "two sides" to this story? Explain why it is important to consider the perspective of a writer and how their writing "colors" our perceptions. Can you name other times this happens in the Bible? In life?
- Apologetics is the reasoned defense and explanation of a particular belief, often in a religious context, to those who hold different views or have questions about it. It involves systematically presenting arguments and evidence to support a particular position, address criticisms, and clarify misunderstandings. The term originates from the Greek word "apologia," meaning a verbal defense or justification.

In his book *Transforming*, Austen Hartke makes the point that those from the LGBTQI2A community end up spending much of their time doing apologetics and defending themselves. Almost every book has a chapter that explains why the story of Sodom and Gomorrah is not about same gender relationships or why God's creation of Adam and Eve doesn't mandate the existence of only two sexes. He asks the questions, "But if we spend all our time focusing on what's wrong, how do we do what's right? When do we get to see the Bible as a life-giving fount of grace for all people? When do we get to hear God speaking into our lives if we're focused on proof-texting our arguments?"

Austen makes the argument that time, resources and talents are being wasted over apologetics, rather than simply being genuinely welcoming. What specific things has WPC done to make itself a more "affirming" community for LGBTQI2A?

- 3. What do you think about the statement, "Too often the church is a stumbling block that catches the feet of LGBTQI2A people on the road to God, rather than the sanctuary that houses the fountain of living water." What more could WPC be doing to be a "sanctuary that houses the fountain of living water?"
- 4. Are you prepared to counter transphobic lies and misconceptions that you may encounter in conversation or on social media? What reliable resources can you lean on if you have questions, or need to understand the arguments better?
